✓ **NSF Website, FastLane and Research.gov Unavailable June 30-July 4**

The National Science Foundation is moving its Data Center IT servers to the new NSF headquarters in Alexandria, Va. Because of this move, the NSF website, FastLane and Research.gov will be unavailable from June 30 at 7 p.m. CDT until July 4 at 5 p.m. CDT. During this outage period, there will be no access to these websites, proposals cannot be submitted in FastLane, and project reports and cash requests cannot be submitted in Research.gov. Limited Submission: CDC SHEPheRD Pre-proposals Due June 22

The Office of the VPR is accepting pre-proposals for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Safety and Healthcare Epidemiology Prevention Research Development program. Projects will address Antimicrobial Use and Resistance in Aquaculture. Project budgets will range between \$300,000 and \$500,000, with a project period of 12 months.
